From 30 Mason Jars to One Cure Puck: A Game Changer

Home cultivation operation

1 Cure Puck in operation (Gen 1)

14-21 day cure duration

THE PROBLEM

Cory was juggling kids and a busy life while trying to manually burp 30-plus mason jars every day - spending 20 minutes a day opening and closing each one. Even with hygrometers in each jar, his cures came out inconsistent: some buds got too dry, others had a chlorine or grainy taste, and flower in storage would crumble apart

THE SOLUTION

Cory mounted a single Gen 1 Cure Puck on a five gallon bucket and loaded it with his White Widow harvest. Instead of daily jar-by-jar burping, he just gave the bucket a quick shake every day or two. The Cure Puck handled the rest, sending notifications straight to his phone so he could monitor the cure from the road.

THE RESULTS

- Dispensary-comparable taste and smell
- Pillowy, properly cured buds that hold their form
- Eliminated over-drying and inconsistent cure results
- Saved 20 min/day opening jars for 1 to 1.5 months
- Notifications for remote monitoring while on the road
- Considers \$299 Gen 1 investment already paid for itself
